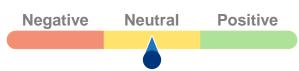
Gold Stands Out to Have the Long Term Structural Positive Trend

Expectation

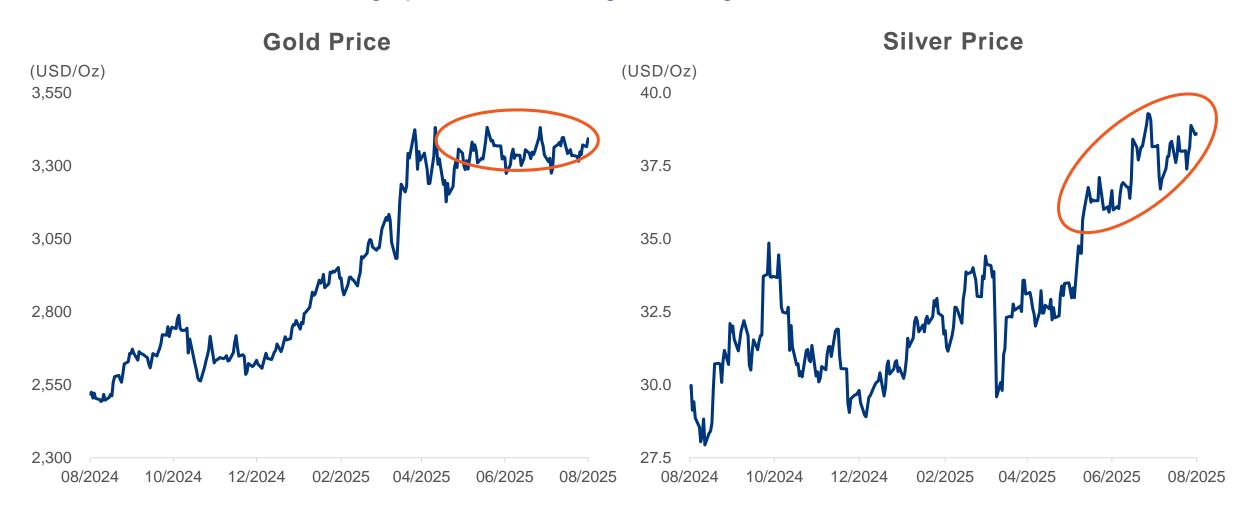
- 1. The strength of the US and Global economies

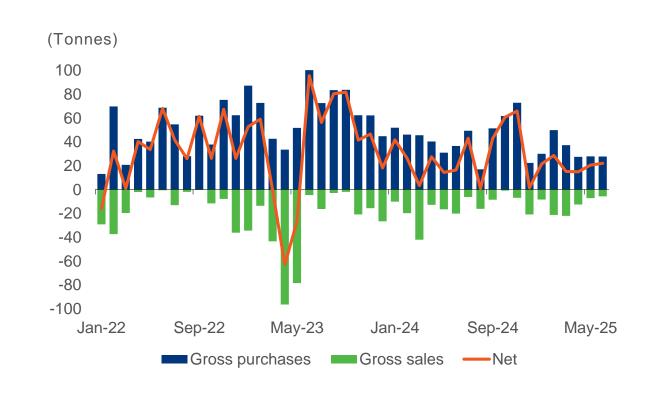
Structural Bullishness Remains but Central Banks Buying Has Slowed

Time to Digest – Turning US\$3,400 Level From a Price Cap Into a Floor

Gold

- The long-term trend of de-dollarization remains:
 - 1. Reduction in global trade with the US;
 - 2. Weaponization of the US dollar;
 - 3. Interest rate decline expectation to drive further dollar weakness.
- After 25% increase in gold price over the past year, Central banks will need to see consolidation of prices at current level to establish a price floor before they start more meaningful buying again.

Expected Cut in Funding Cost by the Fed and Further Slide in the US Dollar Are the Likely Catalysts

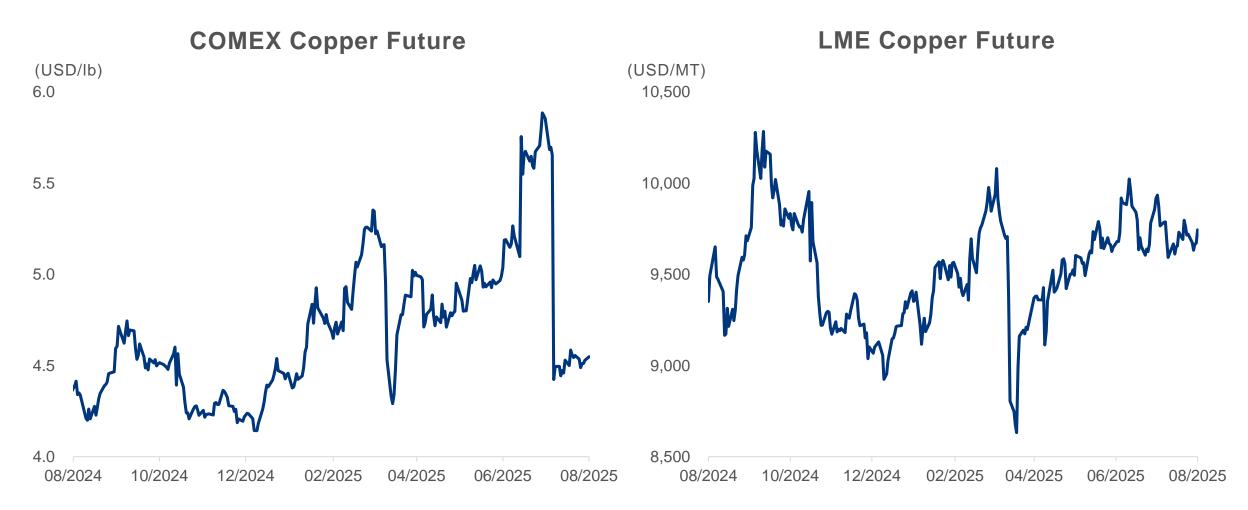
Gold ETF AUM vs Underlying Gold Tonnes

All Due to Front Loading Ahead of Trump's Tariff Supposing on Copper Which Turned Out to Be None

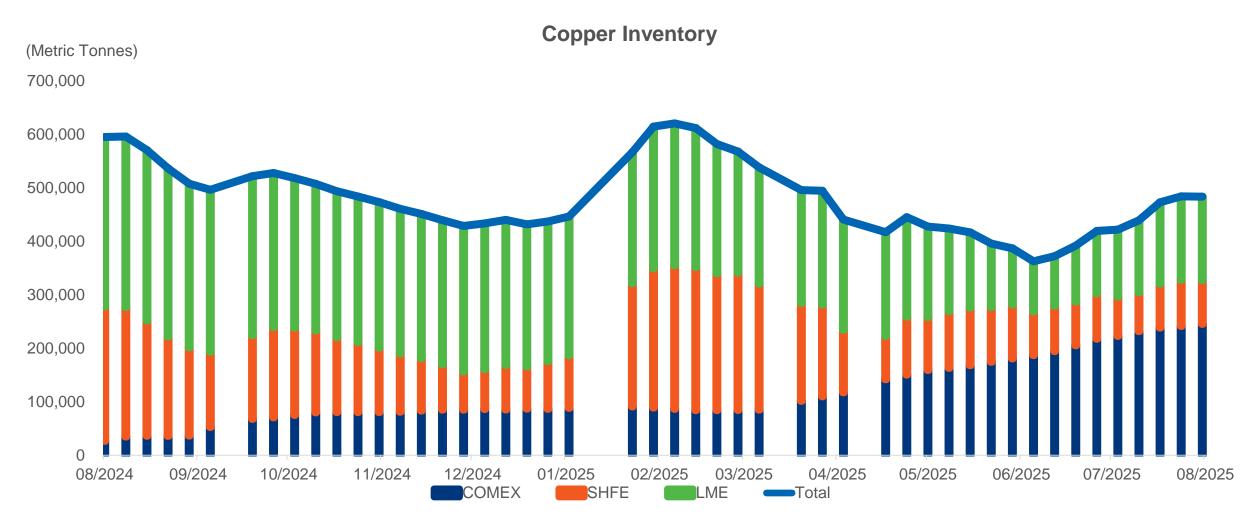

Destocking Is Happening in the US and Will Take 6-8 Months



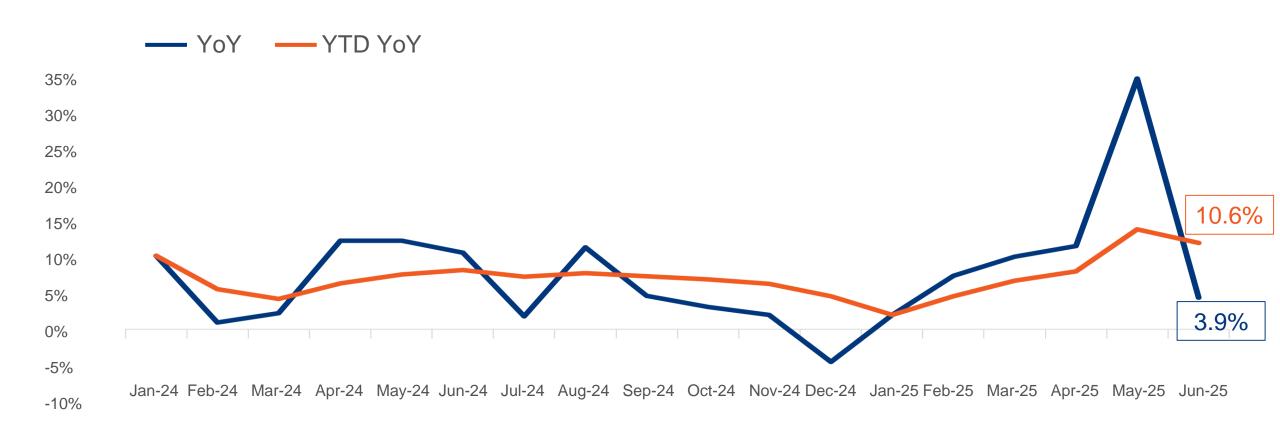




Weighted End-Use Demand of Copper Is Not Supportive in the 2H25

End-use Demand of Copper in China

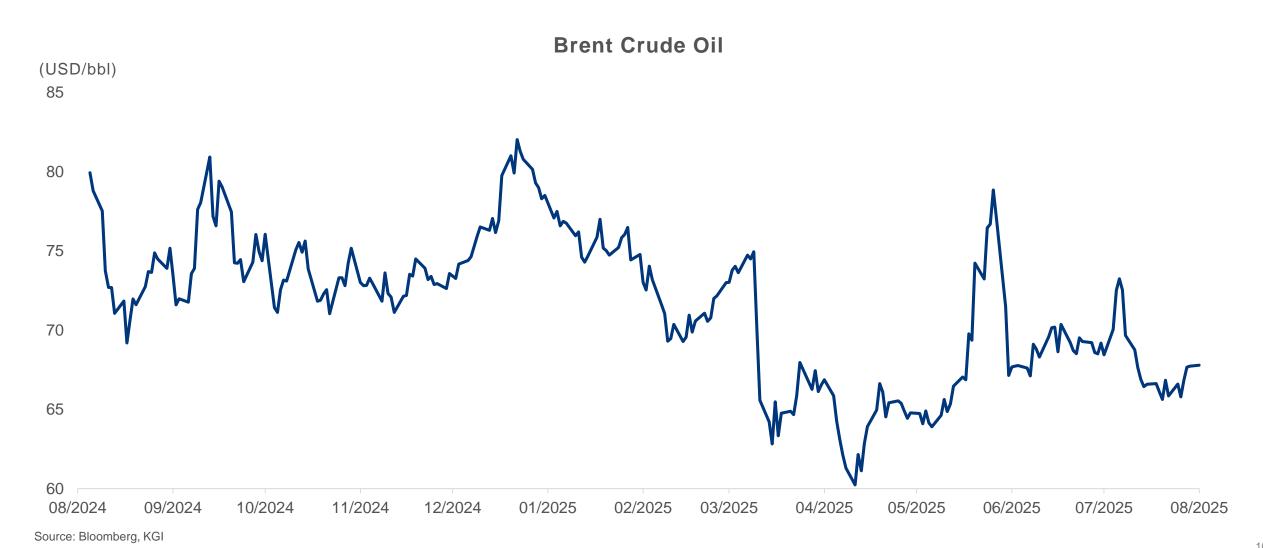






Brent Crude Oil Range Bounding at US\$65-75

Soft Global Economy, De-Escalation of Tensions in Iran, Israel/Palestine and Ukraine Are Not Good for Oil Price

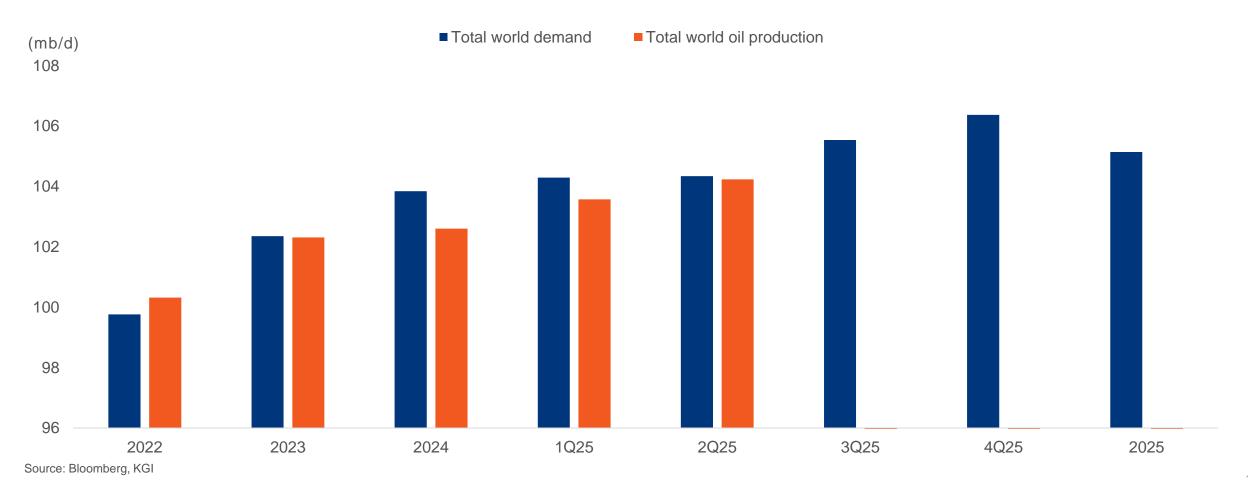




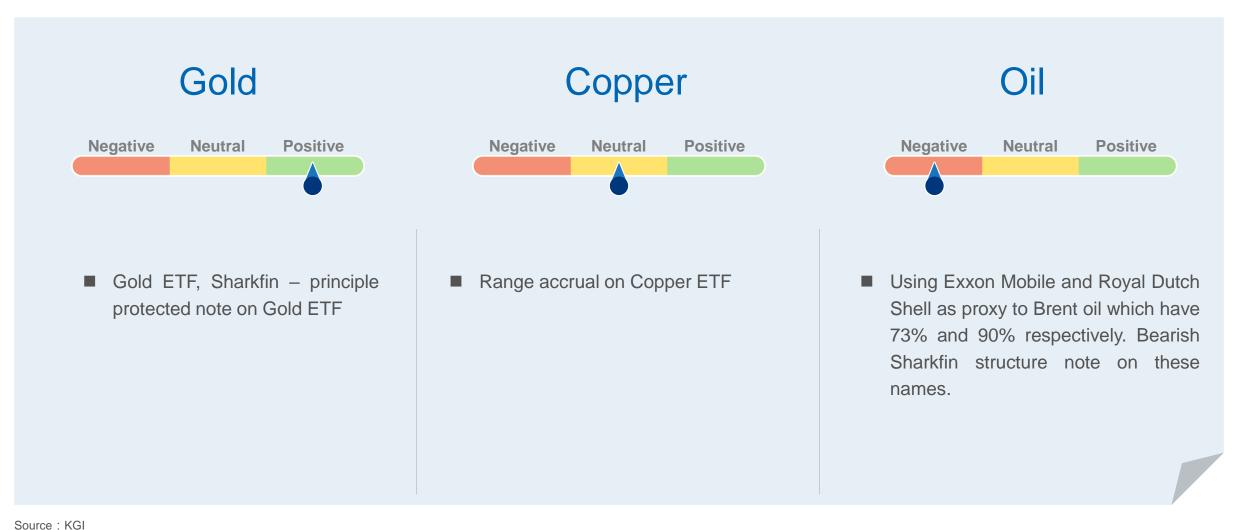
OPEC Is Creeping up the Production Target
